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CHAPTER 01

Operational Discipline

Practical conversations on operational discipline designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

When Did Abnormal Become Acceptable?

WHY THIS MATTERS

Repeated abnormal conditions can become familiar without becoming safe. Treat every recurring alarm, leak, vibration or workaround as evidence that risk is being carried.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Identify one condition your team has started calling normal and confirm who owns its correction.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What abnormal condition are we currently tolerating because it has not yet caused harm?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

An Operating Limit Is a Decision Point

WHY THIS MATTERS

A limit is not a production target. It marks the point where predetermined action is required to protect people, equipment and containment.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Review one critical limit and state the exact response before the next shift handover.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which operating limit is easiest to approach gradually without noticing the growing risk?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Stable Production Does Not Prove Healthy Barriers

WHY THIS MATTERS

A process can look steady while safeguards are degraded, bypassed or overdue for testing. Output is not evidence of protection.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Check the status of one safety-critical barrier that is not visible from the main process trend.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which hidden barrier could fail while production still appears completely stable?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Watch the Trend, Not Only the Reading

WHY THIS MATTERS

A value inside the limit can still be moving in the wrong direction. Trend, rate of change and related variables often provide the earliest warning.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Select one key parameter and review its direction over the previous shift, not just its current value.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which trend would give us the earliest warning of loss of control?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

The Procedure Is a Control

WHY THIS MATTERS

A procedure captures the safe sequence, hold points and recovery actions. Skipping a step removes a layer of protection even when the task feels familiar.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Pause before a routine task and identify the step most vulnerable to being performed from memory.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Where does experience help us, and where might it tempt us to bypass the written sequence?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Verify Before You Declare Normal

WHY THIS MATTERS

Normal status should be demonstrated through indications, field confirmation and expected response—not assumed because no alarm is active.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Choose one restored system and verify its status through two independent indications.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What evidence do we require before declaring this equipment fully returned to service?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

A Shortcut Changes the Risk

WHY THIS MATTERS

A shortcut does more than save time; it alters assumptions, removes controls and can expose others who do not know the method changed.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Challenge one informal shortcut and compare it with the approved method before work begins.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What risk is transferred to the next person when a shortcut is not communicated?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Routine Work Still Deserves Attention

WHY THIS MATTERS

Familiar tasks often receive less conscious attention even though their hazards remain. Repetition can reduce alertness faster than it reduces risk.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Name the single most credible failure during today's most routine task.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which routine job on this site receives less attention than its consequences deserve?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Stop and Reassess When Conditions Change

WHY THIS MATTERS

A safe plan belongs to the conditions assessed. Weather, equipment status, simultaneous work or staffing changes can invalidate it.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Use a deliberate stop point today whenever the job environment changes.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What change would automatically trigger a new risk assessment for this task?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

CHAPTER 02

Hazard Recognition and Dynamic Risk

Practical conversations on hazard recognition and dynamic risk designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

See the Energy Before the Task

WHY THIS MATTERS

Every task involves energy—pressure, electricity, gravity, motion, heat or chemicals. The hazard becomes clearer when the energy path is traced.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Before starting, name each energy source and the barrier that keeps it controlled.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which energy source is easiest to overlook during this job?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

The Line of Fire Moves

WHY THIS MATTERS

Line-of-fire exposure changes as loads swing, pressure builds, tools shift and people reposition. A safe starting position may become unsafe moments later.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Mark the likely movement path and keep people outside it throughout the task.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

How could the line of fire change after the job has started?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

A Small Change Can Create a Large Risk

WHY THIS MATTERS

Temporary hoses, substituted tools, revised sequences and changed personnel can interact in ways the original plan did not consider.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Ask what assumptions changed and whether the controls still match the new arrangement.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which apparently minor change has the greatest potential to alter today's risk?

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Housekeeping Is Hazard Control

WHY THIS MATTERS

Poor housekeeping hides leaks, narrows escape routes, creates trip hazards and makes abnormal conditions harder to detect.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Remove one obstruction or source of clutter before it becomes part of the work environment.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What is our housekeeping condition telling us about operational discipline?

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Look Above, Below and Behind

WHY THIS MATTERS

Hazards are often outside the worker's immediate field of view: overhead loads, drains, blind corners, suspended objects and adjacent systems.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Complete a deliberate 360-degree scan before the task and after every major change.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What hazard would be missed if we looked only at the work in front of us?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

The Weather Is Part of the Job

WHY THIS MATTERS

Heat, rain, wind, lightning and poor visibility change grip, footing, communication, exposure and emergency response.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Confirm today's weather trigger points and the authority to suspend work.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which weather condition changes this task first, and how will we recognize it?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Stored Energy Does Not Announce Itself

WHY THIS MATTERS

Trapped pressure, charged capacitors, elevated loads and compressed springs can remain hazardous after shutdown.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Identify, dissipate and independently verify every form of stored energy.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Where could energy remain trapped after the normal isolation steps?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Interfaces Create Hidden Hazards

WHY THIS MATTERS

Risk increases where teams, systems, permits or contractors meet. Each party may understand its own work but miss the interaction.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Hold a short interface check with every affected workgroup before simultaneous work begins.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which assumption is one team making about another team's controls?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

CHAPTER 03

Permit to Work and Isolation

Practical conversations on permit to work and isolation designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

A Permit Is a Live Control

WHY THIS MATTERS

A permit remains valid only while its stated scope, conditions, isolations and interfaces remain true.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Compare the permit with actual field conditions immediately before work starts.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What change would make this permit no longer valid?

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An Isolation Is a Verified Condition

WHY THIS MATTERS

A line on a certificate does not stop energy. Physical separation, correct identification and proof of effectiveness do.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Trace the isolation boundary and verify zero energy at the worksite.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

How do we know the isolation protects this exact task location?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Zero Pressure Is Not Zero Energy

WHY THIS MATTERS

A gauge at zero may hide a blocked impulse line, trapped liquid, vacuum, temperature or mechanical energy.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Use an approved proving method and consider every energy form before opening containment.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What could make a zero indication misleading here?

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A Dark Indicator Is Not Proof of a Dead Circuit

WHY THIS MATTERS

Loss of indication can mean loss of supply—or a failed lamp, instrument or wiring path. Absence of light is not electrical isolation.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Test for dead with the correct proven instrument at the point of work.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What independent evidence confirms this circuit cannot energize?

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Isolation Boundaries Must Match the Work

WHY THIS MATTERS

An isolation that protects one flange may not protect an extended scope, a second opening or connected equipment.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Reconfirm the boundary whenever the task location or scope changes.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Has the work expanded beyond the protection provided by the original isolation?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Temporary Defeats Need Visible Control

WHY THIS MATTERS

Bypasses and overrides remove designed protection. Their risk must be assessed, authorized, logged, communicated and time-bound.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Review every active defeat for necessity, compensating controls and restoration date.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Who knows this protection is unavailable, and what are they doing differently?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Prove the Test Point

WHY THIS MATTERS

Verification is only meaningful when the test point represents the energy at the actual worksite and the test instrument itself is proven.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Prove the tester before and after use and confirm the test location is valid.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Could this test point be isolated from the hazard we intend to verify?

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Reinstatement Is a Controlled Task

WHY THIS MATTERS

Removing isolations can reintroduce energy, pressure and movement. Reinstatement requires readiness checks and communication.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Confirm work completion, personnel clearance and system alignment before de-isolation.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Who could be affected when this system is returned to service?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

CHAPTER 04

Process Safety and Barrier Management

Practical conversations on process safety and barrier management designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

An Alarm Is a Call to Act

WHY THIS MATTERS

An alarm indicates a condition that requires a defined operator response. Repeated alarms should trigger correction, not acceptance.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

For one frequent alarm, confirm the cause, required response and escalation point.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which alarm risks becoming background noise in our workplace?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

A Bypassed Protection Is a Changed Risk

WHY THIS MATTERS

When protection is unavailable, the operating risk changes immediately even if the process condition does not.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Verify the compensating controls and operating restrictions for every active bypass.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Would we still operate this way if the bypass were clearly visible to everyone?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Containment Is Never Just the Pipe

WHY THIS MATTERS

Primary containment depends on flanges, seals, valves, supports, drains, instruments and operating limits working together.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Inspect the complete containment path, including small-bore connections and supports.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which minor component could become the initiating point for a major release?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

The First Sign May Be Weak

WHY THIS MATTERS

Odour, staining, frost, unusual noise or a small instrument drift can be early evidence of deteriorating containment.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Report and investigate weak signals before they become obvious failures.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which weak signal on our plant deserves more attention today?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Safeguards Need Independence

WHY THIS MATTERS

Multiple controls provide less protection when they share the same instrument, power supply, logic or human action.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Check whether claimed safeguards can fail from one common cause.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Are our barriers truly independent or only counted separately?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Proof Testing Protects Confidence

WHY THIS MATTERS

A safety system that has not been tested within its required interval cannot provide the same assurance as one demonstrated to work.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Review one overdue or upcoming proof test and protect its completion date.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What decision changes when proof-test assurance is missing?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Overpressure Protection Needs a Clear Path

WHY THIS MATTERS

A relief device cannot protect equipment if it is isolated, blocked, wrongly set or discharges into a restricted system.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Confirm the protected equipment, set pressure and unobstructed relief route.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What could prevent this relief path from performing when demanded?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Small-Bore Connections Deserve Big Attention

WHY THIS MATTERS

Vibration, corrosion and poor support can make small-bore connections disproportionate contributors to leaks.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Inspect vulnerable connections for movement, damage, staining and inadequate support.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which small connection would be hardest to detect if it began leaking?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Startup Is a High-Risk Transition

WHY THIS MATTERS

During startup, equipment states and process conditions change quickly while safeguards are being established.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Use explicit hold points and verify prerequisites before each introduction of energy or inventory.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which startup step creates the largest change in process risk?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

CHAPTER 05

Human Factors and Performance

Practical conversations on human factors and performance designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

Fatigue Is a System Risk

WHY THIS MATTERS

Fatigue reduces attention, memory, reaction and judgement. It should be managed through planning and supervision, not treated as a personal weakness.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Discuss workload, sleep opportunity and task criticality before assigning demanding work.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which task should never be paired with severe fatigue?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Attentional Tunnelling Hides the Wider Picture

WHY THIS MATTERS

Urgency can focus attention on one alarm or target while other critical cues are missed.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Assign someone to maintain the overall picture during complex troubleshooting.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What important cue could we miss if we focus only on the loudest problem?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Confirmation Bias Selects Comfortable Evidence

WHY THIS MATTERS

People naturally favour information that supports the first explanation. Safe diagnosis actively searches for disconfirming evidence.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Before acting, ask what observation would prove the current diagnosis wrong.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What alternative explanation have we not tested?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Experience Can Create Blind Spots

WHY THIS MATTERS

Experience improves pattern recognition but can also encourage assumptions when a familiar pattern is incomplete.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Invite a second perspective before a high-consequence decision.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What might a less familiar person notice that an expert overlooks?

What information do we discuss openly that could be misused?

Phishing Exploits Urgency and Trust

WHY THIS MATTERS

Suspicious messages often pressure recipients to act quickly, bypass verification or reveal credentials.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Verify unexpected requests through a separate trusted channel before acting.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which feature of a message should make us slow down immediately?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Lost Devices Are Security Events

WHY THIS MATTERS

A lost phone, badge, radio or laptop may provide access, information or operational insight.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Report loss immediately so access can be disabled and exposure assessed.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Do workers know exactly whom to contact after losing a device or badge?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Visitors Need Active Control

WHY THIS MATTERS

A visitor may not understand restricted areas, alarms, hazards or information boundaries.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Confirm identity, briefing, escort and exit recording for every visitor.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

At what point could a visitor become unintentionally unescorted?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Unusual Behaviour Deserves Professional Reporting

WHY THIS MATTERS

Observation should focus on behaviour and credible indicators, not assumptions about identity or background.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Record objective facts and use established reporting channels.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

**How can we report a concern accurately
without exaggeration or bias?**

Leadership Culture and Communication

Practical conversations on leadership culture and communication designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

The Response to Stop Work Shapes Future Reporting

WHY THIS MATTERS

People remember whether a stop-work call was welcomed, investigated and resolved—or punished and dismissed.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Thank the next person who raises a concern and make the resolution visible.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Would our response today make people more or less likely to speak tomorrow?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Leaders Set the Real Standard

WHY THIS MATTERS

Workers judge priorities by what leaders notice, question, reward and tolerate under pressure.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Choose one field interaction today that reinforces the expected standard.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What behaviour are leaders unintentionally signalling is acceptable?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Ask Before You Tell

WHY THIS MATTERS

Good safety conversations uncover how work is actually performed, where it is difficult and which controls are fragile.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Ask a worker what makes the task hardest to do safely, then listen without interruption.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What can frontline workers see that the plan does not show?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Recognition Strengthens Safe Behaviour

WHY THIS MATTERS

Specific recognition tells people which behaviour matters and encourages repetition more effectively than generic praise.

01 **Pause and observe**

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 **Verify the control**

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 **Act and communicate**

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Recognize one precise action that prevented risk or improved control.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which safe behaviour deserves to become visible today?

Accountability Must Be Fair

WHY THIS MATTERS

Fair accountability distinguishes deliberate violations from mistakes, system weaknesses and reasonable adaptations.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Review context and contributing conditions before deciding how to respond.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What system factor made the undesired action more likely?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Production Pressure Must Be Spoken About

WHY THIS MATTERS

Unspoken schedule pressure can influence choices even when nobody explicitly instructs unsafe work.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

State clearly that controls and stop criteria remain valid when deadlines tighten.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Where might the team feel pressure that leaders have not acknowledged?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Good Questions Improve Risk Perception

WHY THIS MATTERS

Questions that explore failure, change and recovery help teams think beyond checklist completion.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Ask: What can go wrong, how will we know, and what will we do first?

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which question would reveal the weakness in today's plan?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Supervision Must Match Task Risk

WHY THIS MATTERS

High-risk, unfamiliar or changing work needs more active supervision than routine stable work.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Confirm the supervisor's availability at critical steps and hold points.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

When is the supervisor most needed at the worksite?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

CHAPTER 12

Continuous Improvement and Personal Ownership

Practical conversations on continuous improvement and personal ownership designed to strengthen recognition, judgement and action.

Good Enough Is a Temporary Condition

WHY THIS MATTERS

A control may be adequate today yet vulnerable to wear, change or new information. Improvement requires continued curiosity.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Identify one control that works but could be made simpler, stronger or more reliable.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Where are we depending on effort when better design could reduce the risk?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Fix the System, Not Only the Symptom

WHY THIS MATTERS

Cleaning a spill, resetting a trip or replacing a damaged item restores the moment but may leave the cause untouched.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Ask why the condition developed and what prevents recurrence.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What will stop the same issue returning on another shift?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Actions Need Owners and Evidence

WHY THIS MATTERS

A recommendation without an owner, due date and completion evidence is an intention, not a control.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Assign clear ownership and define what satisfactory closure will look like.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

How will we know this action changed the risk?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Use Leading Indicators Wisely

WHY THIS MATTERS

Completed checks matter only when they reflect the health of critical controls rather than activity for its own sake.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Choose an indicator connected to a barrier and verify the quality of the underlying work.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Are we measuring useful assurance or simply counting tasks?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Learn From Normal Work

WHY THIS MATTERS

Waiting for incidents overlooks the adaptations and recoveries that keep daily work successful.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Ask workers what nearly made today's job difficult and how they maintained control.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What went right today because someone noticed and adapted early?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Share Lessons Across Boundaries

WHY THIS MATTERS

A lesson confined to one shift, team or contractor cannot protect others facing the same exposure.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Translate one recent lesson into a short, relevant briefing for another group.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Who else performs work with the same risk?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Verify Closure in the Field

WHY THIS MATTERS

Documents can show an action closed while the condition remains unchanged or the fix introduces a new problem.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Visit the worksite and test whether the completed action performs as intended.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What field evidence confirms this action is effective?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Personal Ownership Includes Speaking Up

WHY THIS MATTERS

Ownership is not carrying every problem alone; it is recognizing concerns, acting within authority and escalating promptly.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Raise one unresolved issue through the correct channel and follow it to ownership.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What are we waiting for someone else to notice?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Prepare Tomorrow's Safe Start Today

WHY THIS MATTERS

Materials, permits, isolations, competence and interfaces are easier to correct before the next shift is ready to begin.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Resolve one foreseeable start-up obstacle before handover.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

What could force tomorrow's team to improvise?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Operational Excellence Begins With Daily Discipline

WHY THIS MATTERS

Reliable performance is created by repeated attention to fundamentals, especially when work is routine or pressure is high.

01 Pause and observe

Compare actual conditions with the plan, procedure and expected safe state.

02 Verify the control

Confirm the critical control is present, effective and understood by the people relying on it.

03 Act and communicate

Correct what is within your authority and escalate anything that remains uncertain or degraded.

TODAY'S ACTION

Choose one critical standard and demonstrate it without compromise today.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Which daily discipline most strongly protects our people and operation?

Operational excellence begins with daily discipline.

Continue the Conversation

The value of a daily HSSE message is not measured by how polished it sounds. It is measured by what people notice, discuss and change because of it. Keep the conversation specific, respectful and connected to real work. One honest question and one completed action can strengthen a barrier, prevent an exposure and protect a life.
